Dear BPS Partners,

With the recent release of the second draft of the district's reopening plan, we have been working to solidify our plans around partner access to school buildings for the 2020-21 school year. We appreciate your patience as we worked to determine how to best proceed, with a focus on the health and safety of our students and staff.

In order to minimize health risks, Boston Public Schools (BPS) will limit school building access to only students, BPS and City of Boston staff. There is no scheduled end date to these limitations at this time. School leaders will work with partners to connect students and families with remote services and programs. Many of you have already transitioned to an online platform and we are grateful for your continued support of our students.

Some partners have secured alternative sites for in-person programming while others are seeking space. We are working to create a list of available spaces throughout our neighborhoods where partners may potentially offer programs.
